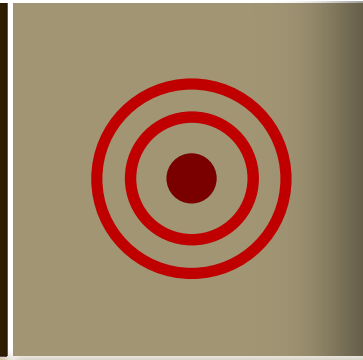
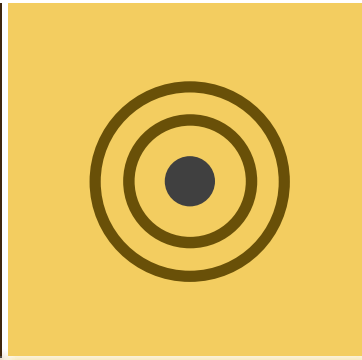
4 out of 8 RAI WP 2014-2015

Global challenges have made the world more
difficult to govern today, compared to 20 years
ago.

States can no longer govern alone; they
need assistance. The role of civil society
has gradually changed – from a monitor
and corrector of states' actions to an
active co-participant in governance.

WP Objective 1
Transparent
rules: move away from discretion to rule-based political and administrative decision making by conducting risk assessment, by adopting public, simple and enduring rules;

Point 2

WP Objective 4
Public awareness: researchers, whistleblowers, media and other agencies should be actively supported and their findings considered and given ample publicity

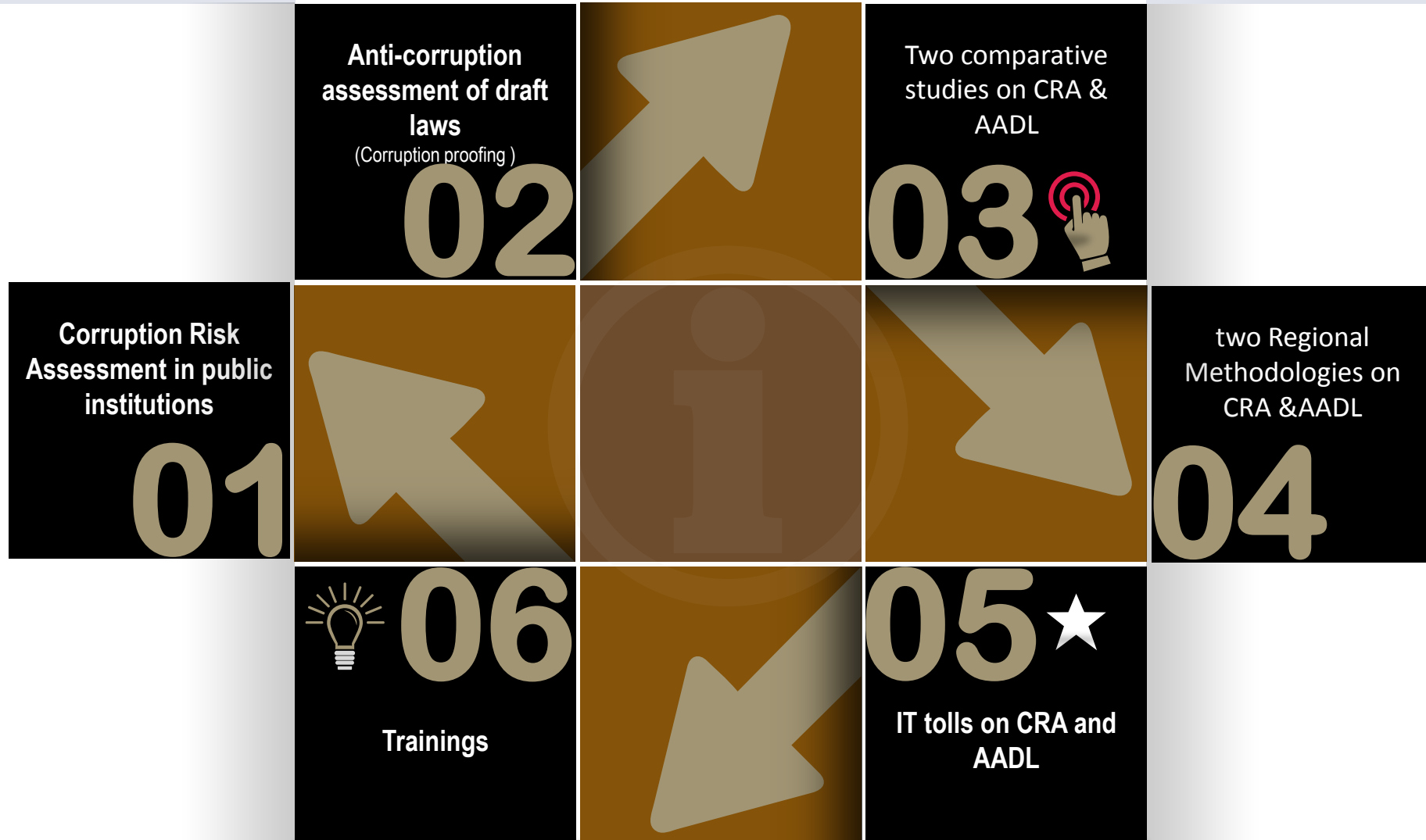
Point 3

WP Objective 2
Public Procurement: make as mandatory as possible for all government procurement to be competitive with as few barriers to participation as possible (given the nature of the tender) by unifying standards;

WP Objective 8
Effective monitoring mechanism for implementation of the national anti-corruption strategies and action plans.

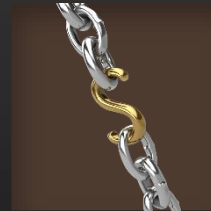
